Nord-Sud XXI welcomes the UPR Report on South Africa.

Nord-Sud XXI has a longstanding and strong appreciation for the people of South Africa. We assisted their struggle for self-determination and the end of apartheid had as our honorary President for a short time before he became President of South Africa, His Excellency Nelson Mandela.
